Coelogyne

Coelogynes are a large group with many different types of species. Some are high altitude cool growers, whilst others are from lower, warmer climates, over a wide area of South East Asia across to India and the Himalayas. Some have a lovely scent and others hold their flowers on long, pendent stems.



Temperature - Cool species Min. 8°C Max. 25°C.

Warm species Min. 14°C Max. 28°C

Light - To help with re-flowering keep all coelogynes shaded from the bright summer sun but with good light in winter.

Watering - For cool species - Regularly water in summer and in winter give a rest period when hardly any water is required. This is necessary for the re-flowering. Warmer species can be kept damp all year with a bit less in winter.

Feeding - Feed with a Grow feed in spring/summer changing to Bloom feed in the autumn. No feed is needed in the winter.

Bark Type - Use a medium grade orchid bark for repotting.

Re-Potting - Repot in the spring or after flowering.

Flowering - The season varies from type to type throughout the year

Extra Info - Cool species include ochracea, cristata, flaccida, ovalis, speciosa. Warm species include massangeana, velutina, asperata, pandurata, multiflora. Mist all types regularly in spring and summer.

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
