Cool Dendrobium

The Dendrobium family is one of the largest and comes from all over the Far East. They have an unusual habit of growth, tall, thin pseudobulbs, or 'canes'. They produce their flowers along the length of the cane. New canes are produced from the base after flowering. **DO NOT CUT OFF THE CANES** unless they have died back and gone brown.



Temperature - Min. 8°C Max. 20°C

Light - To help with re-flowering keep all dendrobiums shaded from the bright summer sun but good light in winter.

Watering - Regularly water in summer and in winter give a rest period when hardly any water is required. This is necessary for the re-flowering.

Feeding - Feed with a Grow feed in spring/summer changing to Bloom feed in the autumn. No feed is needed in the winter.

Bark Type - Use a medium grade orchid bark for repotting.

Re-Potting - Repot in the spring or after flowering.

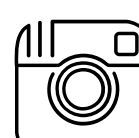
Flowering - The season is usually spring but this can vary with modern growing.

Extra Info - Dendrobiums can produce baby plants, or "Keikis", if kept too warm and wet in winter. These can grow instead of flower buds so the cool, dry rest is essential.

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
