Dendrochilum

Dendrochilums are known as the “Chain Orchids” due to their many tiny flowers being held on long arching or pendent flower stems. Usually coloured in cream, white or yellow but there are also red/orange species. They originate from The Philippines and grow epiphytically on trees. This is a relatively easy group to grow for beginners and are often fragrant.



Temperature - Min. 12°C Max. 25°C

Light - To help with re-flowering keep intermediate species shaded from the bright summer sun but in good light in winter.

Watering - Regularly water in summer and in winter give a little occasionally in order to keep the pseudobulbs plump. Some species continue to grow throughout the winter season.

Feeding - Feed with a Grow feed in spring/summer changing to Bloom feed in the autumn. Continue to feed any species that are still growing in winter.

Bark Type - Use a medium grade orchid bark for repotting.

Re-Potting - Repot when growing and making roots, after flowering.

Flowering - The season will vary between species.

Extra Info - If your Dendrochilum is growing through the winter continue to water and feed it. *D. glumaceum* is a good example of this as it flowers in January/February time.

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
