Intermediate Species

Intermediate growing orchid species need a little more heat than the cooler types but not as much as warm growing orchids.

Popular genera in this group include Dendrochilum, Maxillaria, Cattleya, Zygopetalum, Miltonia, Coelia and Aspasia plus warmer species of Coelogyne.



Temperature - Min. 12°C Max. 25°C

Light - To help with re-flowering keep intermediate species shaded from the bright summer sun but good light in winter.

Watering - Regularly water in summer and in winter give a little occasionally in order to keep the pseudobulbs plump. Some species continue to grow throughout the winter season.

Feeding - Feed with a Grow feed in spring/summer changing to Bloom feed in the autumn. Continue to feed any species that are still growing in winter.

Bark Type - Use a medium grade orchid bark for repotting.

Re-Potting - Repot when growing and making roots, after flowering.

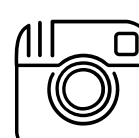
Flowering - The season will vary between genera and species.

Extra Info - If you have problems keeping the temperature down then these would rather be a little warmer with the warm orchids than too cold with the cool orchids.

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
