Oncidium

This group of orchids has such a wide range of colours, shapes and patterns. Ranging from large showy flowers on compact stems to tall branching spikes of many tiny bright blooms. The plants are compact in habit so making them easy to cope with in the home grown as windowsill orchids.



Temperature - Min. 10°C Max. 25°C

Light - Keep shaded from bright, direct summer sun as this can scorch the leaves. Give as much light as possible during the dull winter months.

Watering - Keep the free-draining bark compost moist with more frequent watering in the spring and summer, the main growing season. Never let the pot stand in water. Allow the compost to dry out slightly before watering again.

Feeding - Feed with a Grow feed in spring/summer changing to Bloom feed in the autumn. No feed is need in the winter if the plant is not active.

Bark Type - Use a medium grade orchid bark for repotting.

Re-Potting - Repot in the spring or after flowering.

Flowering - The season can vary with modern hybrids.

Extra Info - Modern hybrids can be a mix of other genera including Miltonia, Brassia, Miltoniopsis as well as Oncidium. This can make them a bit more tolerant of warmer temperatures.
