Vanda

Vanda hybrids are traditionally bred and grown in the Far East for cut flower as the blooms have a good, long-lasting quality. They are commonly grown hanging up by a small plastic basket with long, aerial roots exposed to the air. In their native countries it is always very humid with regular rainfall. To grow them at home is more challenging so there are 3 main ways to grow these orchids:



1. Hanging with their roots exposed and sprayed heavily with water daily in summer, every 2-3 days in winter.
2. Placed in a glass vase with a little water in the base and sprayed regularly. This helps to keep a humid environment around the roots.
3. Potted in loose coarse bark chippings with the majority of the aerial roots in the bark to help keep them moist and prevent dehydration.

Temperature - Min. 18°C Max. 28°C

Light - To help with re-flowering keep vandas in good light all year round. Just out of the brightest summer sun.

Watering - Spray regularly all year round and if in a pot allow to dry out inbetween waterings.

Feeding - Feed with a Grow feed in spring/summer changing to Bloom feed in the autumn. No feed is needed in the winter.

Bark Type - Use a coarse grade orchid bark if in a pot.

Re-Potting - Repot in the spring or after flowering.

Flowering - They flower 1-2 times a year in any season.
