Warm Species

Warmer growing orchid species need a little more care when growing in the British climate as we have quite a temperate environment here. They often come from lower altitude habitats in South America, Africa and the Far East. This extra warmth can mean that the plants dry out a bit more quickly so they may need more regular watering and spraying to increase the humidity.



Temperature - Min. 18°C Max. 30°C

Light - Keep shaded from the brightest summer sun but in good light in winter.

Watering - Regularly water in summer and in winter give a little occasionally in order to keep the pseudobulbs plump. Some species continue to grow throughout the winter season.

Feeding - Feed with a Grow feed in spring/summer changing to Bloom feed in the autumn. Continue to feed any species that are still growing in winter.

Bark Type - Use a medium grade orchid bark for repotting.

Re-Potting - Repot when growing and making roots, after flowering.

Flowering - The season will vary between genera and species.

Extra Info - Popular genera in this group include Bulbophyllum, Vanda, Angraecum, Paphiopedilum, Phragmipedium, warmer species of Coelogyne, Cymbidium and Dendrobium.

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
